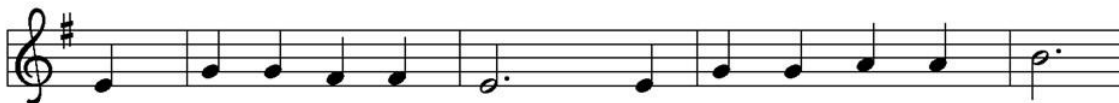


***THE GREAT THANKSGIVING**
